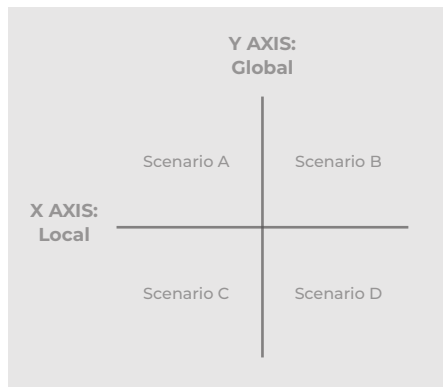


Choose one global driver and one local driver from the list to create two axes that will drive your scenarios.
